| 1. Lilac on black. F812 col 4 | - ½yard (40cm) |
| 2. Sweetpea on white. F795 col5 | - ½yard (½m) |
| 3. Hydrangea. F814 col 2 | - ½yard (40cm) |
| 4. Hyacinth. F811 col 6 | - long¼ |
| 5. Violets F813 col 3 | - long¼ |
| 6. Sweet pea on black. F795 col 2 | - ⅝yard (70cm) |
| 7. Perfect Palette H50 col 3 purple | - 1⅜yard (1.20cm) |
| 8. Perfect PaletteH50 col 15 lilac | - ¾yard (70cm) |
- Wadding and backing 62" x 62"

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

18 x 5⅜" x 5⅜" squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 2 cut

9 x 7¼" x 7¼" squares, cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 3 cut

8 x 7¼" x 7¼" squares, cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 4 cut

4 x 7¼" x 7¼" squares, cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 5 cut

8 x $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x $9\frac{3}{4}$ " strips, see angle cut diagram 1 (for inset triangles)

4 x $2\frac{5}{8}$ " x $5\frac{1}{8}$ " rectangles, see angle cut diagram 2

From fabric 6 cut

2 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $51\frac{3}{8}$ " strips for border

2 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $57\frac{3}{8}$ " strips for border

From fabric 7 cut

4 x $7\frac{1}{4}$ " x $7\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice
8 x $4\frac{3}{4}$ " x $18\frac{1}{8}$ " strips, see angle cut diagram 1 (for inset triangles)

4 x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x $3\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once

4 x $4\frac{3}{4}$ " x $9\frac{3}{8}$ " rectangles, see angle cut diagram 2

1 x $4\frac{1}{4}$ " x $4\frac{1}{4}$ " squares cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 8 cut

9 x $7\frac{1}{4}$ " x $7\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice


36 x 2" x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " rectangles, see angle cut diagram 3

cut 45° angles from bottom right and left corners

cut a 45° angle from the top right corner

cut a 45° angle from the top left corner

Sewing

Remember to press each seam after sewing to achieve a crisp finish to your work.

After cutting lay out all the pieces by fabric type and shape ready for use.

1. Lay out all the pieces needed for the block referring to the picture for fabric selection.
2. The block is made up from four small squares, each square is made in the same way.
3. Stitch the top (shorter) edge of the angle cut piece to the large triangle to make a bigger triangle.
4. Stitch the two smaller triangles together to make a larger triangle.

5. Stitch these two triangles together to make a square.
6. Make another three squares in the same way and stitch them together rotating each successive square by 90° to create a pinwheel effect..
Make another eight blocks in the same way.


Block 1


1. Lay out all the pieces needed for the block referring to the picture for fabric selection.
2. This block is also made up from four smaller squares, stitch the four triangles in each square together in pairs to make larger triangles and then sew these together to make a square.
3. Repeat for the other three parts of the block
4. Stitch the squares together rotating each successive square by 90° to create a pinwheel effect.
5. Make another three blocks in the same way.

Block 2



Inset triangles and corner triangles

1. Lay out the three pieces needed to make the triangle, see diagram below.
2. Stitch the small triangle to the centre section and then add the last piece to make a large triangle.
3. Make another seven in the same way.
4. The corner triangles are made up following the same sequence as the inset triangles, make four.



Assembling the quilt

1. Lay out all the blocks, inset triangles and corner triangles following the sequence shown in the main picture.
2. Work diagonally in rows beginning at the top left corner of the quilt, the corner triangles will be added last.
3. Row 1:- inset triangle; block 1; inset triangle.
Row 2:- inset triangle; block 1; block 2; block 1; inset triangle
Row 3:- block 1; block 2; block 1; block 2; block 1.
Row 4:- inset triangle; block 1; block 2; block 1; inset triangle
Row 5:- inset triangle; block 1; inset triangle.
4. Stitch the rows together and add the corner triangles.
5. Add the border strips, stitching the side pieces first then the top and bottom pieces.
6. Layer together the quilt top, wadding and backing fabric and pin or baste in place.
7. Quilt by hand or machine.
8. Add the binding using fabric 7 to complete the project.
