



Summer`s Day Blue quilt

Size 48" x 48" block size 12" x 12"

All fabrics are by Fabric Freedom
Please read through all the instructions before you begin.

Requirements

| 1. Large blue clematis F902 col.3 | - 1/2yard - 1/2m |
| 2. Small blue clematis on white F903 col.4 | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
| 3. Tonal blue flowers and leaves F904 col.4 | - 1/2yard - 1/2m |
| 4. Small butterflies on tonal blue F905 col.4 | - fat 1/4 |
| 5. Light blue Perfect Palette H50 col.58 | - 5/8yard - 60cm |
| 6. Large blue butterflies F906 col.4 | - fat 1/4 |
| 7. Dark blue Perfect Palette H50 col.28 | - 5/8yard - 60cm |
| 8. Blue and purple swirl F907 col.3 | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
| 9. Large violet clematis F902 col.2 | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
- Wadding and backing 52" x 52"

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

2 x 3 1/4" x 42 1/2"
2 x 3 1/4" x 48"

From fabric 2 cut

9 x 4 7/8" x 4 7/8" cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 3 cut

18 x 5 1/4" x 5 1/4" cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 4 cut

12 x 2 1/2" x 5 3/4"
4 x 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

From fabric 5 cut

9 x 5 1/4" x 5 1/4" cut in half diagonally twice

18 x 4⁷/₈" x 4⁷/₈" cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 6 cut

16 x 2¹/₂" x 5³/₄"

From fabric 7 cut

2 x 1" x 36"

2 x 1" x 37"

2 x 1" x 41"

2 x 1" x 42"

From fabric 8 cut

9 x 4⁷/₈" x 4⁷/₈" cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 9 cut

9 x 6¹/₈" x 6¹/₈"

When you have cut out all the pieces lay them out and stack them by size, shape and colour / pattern ready for use.

Sewing

Remember to press each seam after sewing to achieve the best finish to your work.

Block

Please refer to the picture of the block at each stage.

1. Lay out all of the pieces needed for the block as shown in the picture.
2. Make a 'flying geese' panel by sewing the long sides of two triangles from fabric 3 to the short sides of a triangle from fabric 5. Make another three panels in the same way.
3. Stitch two of the 'flying geese' panels to opposite sides of the centre square.
4. Stitch a small triangle from fabric 5 to each end of the two remaining flying geese panels.
5. Stitch the panels in place on the remaining opposite sides of the centre square.
6. Add the corner triangles as shown, two from fabric 2 and two from fabric 8.
7. This completes the block, make another eight in the same way.
8. Referring to the picture of the completed quilt lay the blocks out in three rows of three and stitch together. Remember to press the seams for each row in opposite directions, as this will make it easier to sew the rows together.

Borders and Finishing

There are four borders for this quilt, two narrow borders using fabric 7 and two wider borders, one using fabrics 4 and 6 and the other using fabric 1.

9. Stitch the first border using narrow strips from fabric 7, sew the side strips first and then the top and bottom strips.
10. Next lay out all of the pieces needed from fabrics 4 and 6 for the second border, stitch the pieces together in four strips of seven rectangles.
11. Stitch a strip to each side of the quilt.
12. Sew a small square from fabric 4 to each end of the two remaining strips and then sew the strips to the top and bottom of the quilt.
13. Stitch the third border using narrow strips from fabric 7, side strips first and then the top and bottom strips.
14. The final border uses strips from fabric 1, again sew the side strips first and then the top and bottom strips.
15. Layer together the quilt top, wadding and backing fabric and pin or baste in place.
16. Quilt by hand or machine.
17. Make a binding from left over pieces of fabric 7 sufficiently wide to go all around the quilt with an overlap of about 4".
18. Sew the binding to the quilt to complete the project.
