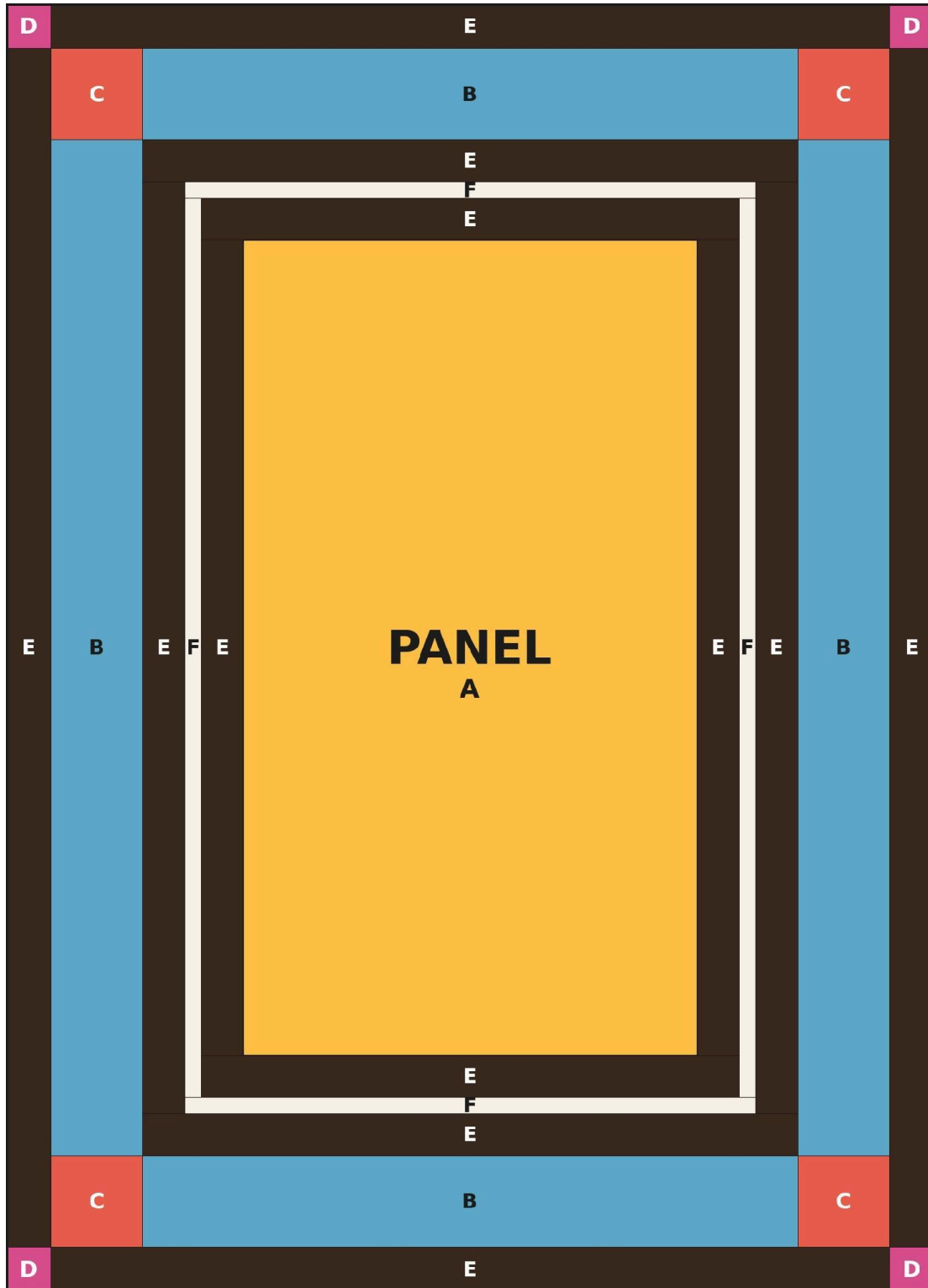


Double-Framed Panel with Corner-Square Borders

Skill Level: Confident Beginner

Finished Quilt Size: 46" x 64"

*Please read all instructions before beginning. Pre-washing recommended for hand dye only.
Pre-washing NOT recommended for other fabrics.*

Generic Color Key

The letters below match the labels used on the quilt diagrams throughout this pattern. Swap in your own fabric choices for each letter.

- A** Fabric A — Panel
- B** Fabric B — Border Stripe
- C** Fabric C — Large Floral Corners
- D** Fabric D — Medium Floral Corners
- E** Fabric E — Frame / Borders
- F** Fabric F — Binding / Thin Frame

Yardages and Cutting

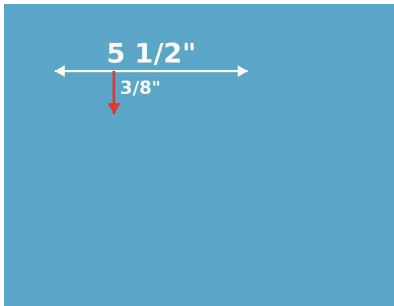
WOF is width of fabric from selvage edge to selvage edge. Remove as little fabric as possible when trimming selvages and squaring strip ends.

Fabric A Panel

- Trim to 22 1/2" x 40 1/2".

1 1/2 yards Fabric B

- Fussy-cut (4) 5 1/2" x LOF strips for exact stripe only. Trim to 2 strips each 49 1/2" and 31 1/2".



1/2 yard Fabric C

- Fussy-cut (4) 5 1/2" squares.

1/2 yard Fabric D

- Fussy-cut (4) 3" squares.

1 1/4 yard Fabric E

- 4 strip 2 1/2" x WOF; cut into (2) 2 1/2" x 41 1/2" strips and (2) 2 1/2" x 26 1/2" strips.
- 4 strips 2 1/2" x WOF.
- 5 strips 3" x WOF for outer border.

3/4 yard Fabric F

- 4 strip 1" x WOF for panel framing.
- 7 strips 2 1/4" x WOF for binding.

3 1/2 yards of 44/45" backing fabric

- 2 pieces 61" x WOF OR
- 2 pieces 79" x WOF directional fabric

OR

1 3/4 yards wide backing fabric

- 1 piece 61" x 79"

Batting

- 1 piece 61" x 79"

Piecing the Blocks

Use a 1/4" seam allowance for all stitching. Press seams as directed.

1. Stitch the (2) 2 1/2" x 41 1/2" Fabric E strips to the sides of the panel and the 2 1/2" x 26 1/2" Fabric E strips to the top and bottom. Press seams toward the strips.
2. Sew the (4) 1" x WOF Fabric F strips short ends together to make a long strip. Press seams to one side. Cut into (2) 44 1/2" strips and (2) 27 1/2" strips.
3. Stitch the 1" x 44 1/2" Fabric F strips to the sides of the panel and the 1" x 27 1/2" Fabric F strips to the top and bottom of the panel. Press seams toward the panel.
4. Sew the (4) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric E strips short ends together to make a long strip. Press seams to one side. Cut into (2) 45 1/2" strips and (2) 31 1/2" strips.
5. Stitch the 2 1/2" x 45 1/2" Fabric E strips to the sides of the panel and the 2 1/2" x 31 1/2" Fabric E strips to the top and bottom of the panel. Press seams toward the panel.
6. Sew (2) 5 1/2" Fabric C squares to the left and right sides of a 5 1/2" x 31 1/2" Fabric B strip to make a top pieced strip, as shown in the exploded diagram. Press seams toward the strips. Repeat to make a bottom pieced strip.
7. Stitch the 5 1/2" x 49 1/2" Fabric B strips to the left and right sides of the panel. Then sew the top and bottom pieced strips to the top and bottom to complete the 41 1/2" x 59 1/2" panel center.
8. Sew the (5) 3" x WOF Fabric E strips short ends together to make a long strip. Press seams to one side. Cut into (2) strips 59 1/2" and (2) strips 41 1/2".
9. Sew (2) 3" Fabric D squares to the left and right sides of a 3" x 41 1/2" Fabric E strip to make an outer top pieced strip, as shown in the exploded diagram. Press seams toward the strips. Repeat to make an outer bottom pieced strip.
10. Stitch the 3" x 59 1/2" Fabric E strips to the left and right sides of the panel. Then sew the outer top and outer bottom pieced strips to the top and bottom to complete the quilt top.
11. If using 44/45" backing fabric, remove the selvage edges from the backing pieces. Join the pieces on the long edges with a 1/2" seam allowance. Press seam open. Trim to make the 61" x 79" backing piece.
12. Layer the top with the backing and batting pieces. Quilt as desired. Trim batting and backing even with the top.
13. Join the Fabric F binding strips on the short ends with diagonal seams to make a long strip. Trim seams to 1/4" and press seams open. Press the strip in half along the length with wrong sides together. Bind the quilt edges using your favorite method to complete the quilt.
