

Whose Nose and Toes

Quilt Designed by eQuilter



47 1/4" x 57 1/2"

Skill Level: Confident Beginner**Finished Quilt Size:** 47 1/4" x 57 1/2"*Please read all instructions before beginning. Pre-washing NOT recommended.*

Yardages and Cutting

WOF is width of fabric from selvage edge to selvage edge. LOF is length of fabric, parallel to the selvage edges. Remove as little fabric as possible when removing selvages and squaring strip ends.

Whose Nose and Toes panel

- Fussy-cut (12) rectangles as follows, keeping the frames centered:
 - (4) frames 8 3/4" x 9 1/2" for elephant question, elephant answer, giraffe question, and giraffe answer frames.
 - (8) frames 8 1/4" x 8 1/2" for tiger, monkey, crocodile and rhino (there are two for each: 'nose and toes question' and 'answer' frames).

1 1/2 yards cream dots

- 1 strip 2" x WOF; trim to 29 3/4" for center sash.
- 4 strips 1 1/2" x WOF; trim to (4) strips 1 1/2" x 29 3/4".
- 2 strips 2" x WOF; trim to (8) strips 2" x 8 1/2".
- 1 strip 2" x WOF; trim to (2) strips 2" x 9 1/2".
- 1 strip 1 3/4" x WOF; trim to (4) strips 1 3/4" x 9 1/2".
- 1 strip 1 1/2" x WOF; trim to (2) strips 1 1/2" x 9 1/2".
- 1 strip 1" x WOF; trim to (4) strips 1" x 8 1/4".
- 6 strips 4" x WOF for outer border.

3/4 yard green dots

- 5 strips 1" x WOF.
- 6 strips 2 1/4" x WOF for binding.

3/4 yard animals allover

- 4 strips 5 1/2" x WOF; trim to (2) strips each 40" and 39 3/4" for border.

3 1/2 yards 44/45" backing fabric OR

4 1/4 yards directional backing fabric

- 2 strips 63" x WOF OR
- 2 strips 73" x WOF for directional fabric

OR

1 3/4 yards wide backing fabric

- 1 piece 63" x 73"

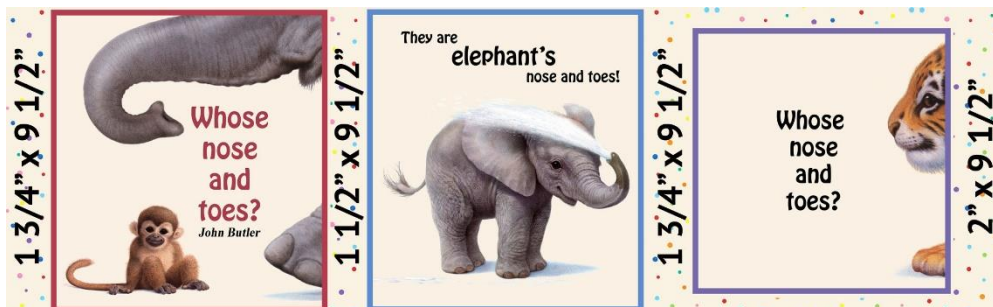
Batting

- 1 piece 63" x 73"

Completing the Quilt

Use a 1/4" seam allowance for all stitching. Press seams as directed. Refer to the exploded quilt diagram on the last page throughout the following steps.

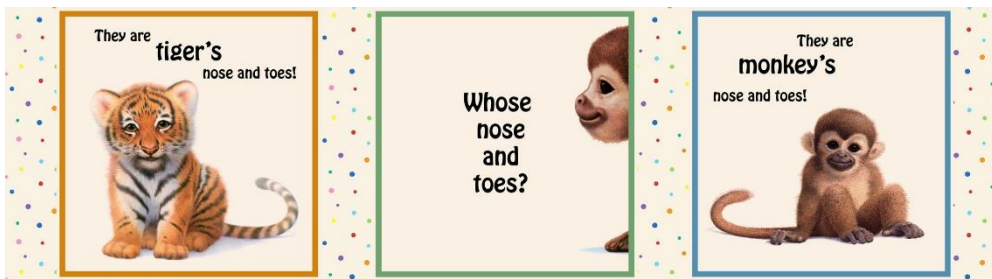
1. Sew a 1" x 8 1/4" cream dots strips to the top and bottom of the tiger question and rhino answer frames. Press seams toward the strips.
2. Join (2) 1 3/4" x 9 1/2" cream dots strips, (1) 1 1/2" x 9 3/4" cream dots strip, and (1) 2" x 9 3/4" cream dots strip, to the elephant question, elephant answer, and tiger question (with cream dots top/bottom from step 1) frames, as shown below to make the top row. Press seams toward the cream dots strips.



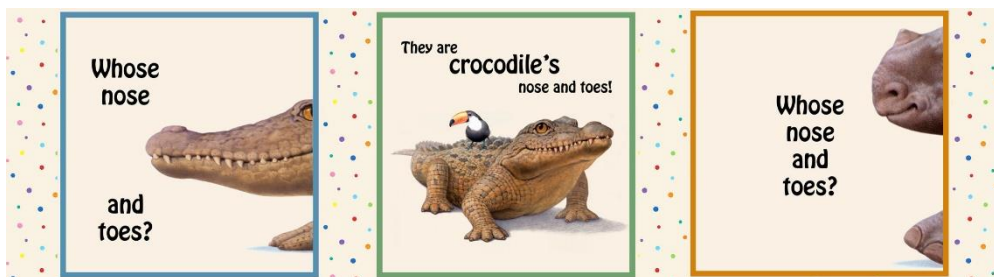
3. Join (2) $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " cream dots strips, (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{3}{4}$ " cream dots strip, and (1) 2 " x $9\frac{3}{4}$ " cream dots strip, to the rhino answer (with cream dots top/bottom from step 1), giraffe question, and giraffe answer frames, as shown below to make the bottom row. Press seams toward the cream dots strips.



4. Join (4) 2 " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " cream dots strips together with the tiger answer, monkey question, and monkey answer frames, as shown below to make the upper middle row. Press seams toward the cream dots strips.



5. Join (4) 2 " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " cream dots strips together with the crocodile question, crocodile answer and rhino question frames, as shown below to make the lower middle row. Press seams toward the cream dots strips.



6. Join (1) 2 " x $29\frac{3}{4}$ " cream dots strip and (4) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $29\frac{3}{4}$ " cream dots strips to the four rows, with the 2 " x $29\frac{3}{4}$ " cream dots strip in the very center to complete the $29\frac{3}{4}$ " x 40 " quilt center. Refer to the exploded diagram for orientation. Press seams toward the cream dots strips.

7. Stitch the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 40 " animal allover strips to the sides of the quilt center and the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $39\frac{3}{4}$ " animal allover strips to the top and bottom. Press seams toward the strips.

8. Sew the 1 " x WOF wide green dots strips short ends together to make a long strip. Cut into 2 strips each 50 " and $40\frac{3}{4}$ ". Stitch the 50 " green dots strips to the sides of the quilt center and the $40\frac{3}{4}$ " green dots strips to the top and bottom. Press seams toward the strips.

9. Sew the 4 " x WOF wide cream dots strips short ends together to make a long strip. Cut into 2 strips each 51 " and $47\frac{3}{4}$ ". Stitch the 51 " strips to the sides of the quilt center and the $47\frac{3}{4}$ " strips to the top and bottom to complete the top.

10. If using $44/45$ " backing fabric, remove the selvage edges from the backing pieces. Join the pieces on the long edges with a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance. Press seam open. Trim to make the 63 " x 73 " backing piece.

11. Layer the quilt top with the backing and batting pieces. Quilt as desired. Trim batting and backing even with the top.

12. Join the green dots binding strips on the short ends with diagonal seams to make a long strip. Press seams in one direction. Press the strip in half along the length with wrong sides together. Bind the quilt edges using your favorite method to complete the quilt.
