



## Bright Spirit Pink and orange Quilt

Size 44" x 50"

All fabrics are designed by Fabric Freedom  
Please read through all the instructions before you begin.

### **Requirements**

| 1. Large butterflies on white F906 col.10  | - 1/2yard - 1/2m |
| 2. Small butterflies on orange F905 col.14 | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
| 3. Orange tonal spot F908 col.2            | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
| 4. Bright multi coloured swirl F907 col.10 | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
| 5. Burgundy Perfect Palette H50 col.4      | - 3/4yard - 70cm |
| 6. Pink tonal spot F908 col.4              | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
| 7. Large butterflies on green F906 col.11  | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
| 8. Small butterflies on green F905 col.11  | - 3/8yard - 40cm |
- Wadding and backing 48" x 54"

### **Cutting**

From fabric 1 cut

- 2 x 3 1/4" x 44 1/2" strips for the sides
- 2 x 3 1/4" x 44" strips for the top and bottom

From fabric 2 cut

- 21 x 2 1/2" x 6 7/8" pieces, cut at 45° from bottom left to top right.

From fabric 3 cut

- 21 x 2 1/2" x 6 7/8" pieces, cut at 45° from bottom left to top right.

From fabric 4 cut

- 21 x 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" pieces.

From fabric 5 cut

- 42 x 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" squares, cut in half diagonally once.
- 2 x 1 1/2" x 38 1/2" strips for the top and bottom inner border.
- 2 x 1 1/2" x 42 1/2" strips for the sides and inner border

From fabric 6 cut

21 x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " pieces, cut at  $45^\circ$  from bottom left to top right

From fabric 7 cut

21 x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces.

From fabric 8 cut

21 x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " pieces, cut at  $45^\circ$  from bottom left to top right



cut a  $45^\circ$  angle from the bottom right corner

When you have cut out all the pieces lay them out and stack them by size, shape, colour and pattern ready for use.

## **Sewing**

Remember to press each seam after sewing to achieve the best finish to your work.

### **Block 1**

Please refer to the picture of the block at each stage, this block uses fabrics 4, 5, 6 and 8

1. Lay out all the pieces needed for the block as shown in the picture.
2. Sew a small triangle from fabric 5 to each of the angle cut pieces from fabrics 6 and 8.
3. Place a piece from fabric 8 between the two pieces you have just made and sew the three elements together to make a square, this completes block 1, make another twenty blocks in the same way.




## Block 2

Please refer to the picture of the block at each stage, this block uses fabrics 2, 3, 5 and 7

4. Lay out all the pieces needed for the block as shown in the picture.
5. Sew a small triangle from fabric 5 to each of the angle cut pieces from fabrics 2 and 3.
6. Place a piece from fabric 7 between the two pieces you have just made and sew the three elements together to make a square, this completes block 2 make another twenty blocks in the same way.

7. Using the picture of the completed quilt as a guide lay out all the blocks in sequence and sew the rows together. Remember to press the seams for each row in opposite directions to make it easier to fit the rows together.
8. Sew the rows together.

### **Borders and Finishing**

9. Add the inner border strips using fabric 5, stitch the side pieces first and then the top and bottom strips.
10. Add the outer border strips using fabric 1, again, stitch the side pieces first and then the top and bottom pieces.
11. Layer together the quilt top, wadding and backing fabric and pin or baste in place.
12. Quilt by hand or machine.
13. Make a binding from left over pieces of fabric 5, sufficiently wide to go all around the quilt with an overlap of about 4".
14. Sew the binding to the quilt to complete the project.
