



Butterfly Carnival

Designed and Made by

Fabrics are from Butterfly Carnival by Fabric Freedom

Please read through all the instructions before you begin. Remember to press each seam after sewing to achieve the best finish to your work.

Requirements

1. Large red butterflies F688 col.23 - ½yard - 40cm
 2. Red and yellow shadow butterflies F691 col.23 - fat ¼
 3. Small butterflies on red F690 col.23 - ⅔yard - 30cm
 4. Red and yellow wing stripe F689 col.23 - ½yard - 40cm
 5. Red wing texture F692 col.23 - long ¼
 6. Yellow wing texture F692 col.26 - long ¼
 7. Orange wing texture F692 col.29 - long ¼
 8. Perfect Palette black H50 col.37 – 1yard - 1m
- Wadding and backing 48" x 48"

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

- 1 x 9"x 9" square.
- 4 x 4¾" x 9" rectangles.
- 4 x 4¾" x 4¾" squares.

From fabric 2 cut

- 4 x 6⅞" x 6⅞" squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 3 cut

- 12 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares, cut in half diagonally once
- 4 x 1½" x 36½" strips.

From fabric 4 cut

- 8 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares, cut in half diagonally once
- 8 x 3½" x 3½"squares.

4 x 1½" x 40½" strips.
 From fabric 5 cut
 4 x 1½" x 42½" strips.
 From fabric 6 cut
 20 x 1½" x 1½" squares.
 12 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares, cut in half diagonally once.
 From fabric 7 cut
 16 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares, cut in half diagonally once
 From fabric 8 cut
 16 x 3½" x 3½" squares.
 8 x 3⅞" x 3⅞" squares, cut in half diagonally once
 4 x 1½" x 34½" strips.
 4 x 1½" x 38½" strips.

Sewing – Before you begin to sew each block lay out all of the pieces needed using the diagrams as a guide.

1. **Block 1** is the centre block. Stitch the short side of two triangles from fabric 7 to adjacent sides of a square from fabric 4. This will give you a large triangle, make another three in the same way.
2. Stitch these four large triangles to the centre square from fabric 1, to complete the block.
3. **Block 2**; this is made up from four mini blocks. First stitch a small triangle from fabric 3 and fabric 6 together to make a square.
4. Next stitch the short side of two triangles from fabric 8 to the square you have just made, to make a large triangle.
5. Stitch this large triangle to a triangle of fabric 2 to complete the mini block. Make another in the same way.
6. For the next mini block stitch a small triangle from fabric 3 and fabric 6 together to make a square, repeat.
7. Stitch these two squares to two squares from fabric 8.
8. Stitch these two pieces together to form a larger square with the fabric 8 squares diagonally opposite each other. Make another in the same way.
9. Stitch the four mini blocks together into a large square with matching blocks diagonally opposite. This completes the block; make another three in the same way.
10. **Block 3** is a 'filler' block; begin by stitching a triangle from fabric 4 to a triangle from fabric 7 to make a larger triangle, repeat.
11. Stitch these two triangles to the short sides of the fabric 1 rectangle, placing fabric 7 next to fabric 1.
12. Stitch two triangles from fabric 7 to adjacent sides of a square from fabric 4, to make a triangle.
13. Sew this triangle to the long side of the fabric 1 rectangle. This completes the block, make another three in the same way.
14. **Block 4** is the final block and makes the corner triangles. Stitch a triangle from fabric 4 to a triangle from fabric 7 to make a larger triangle, repeat.
15. Stitch these two triangles to adjacent sides of a fabric 1 square. This completes the corner block; make another three in the same way.

16. Using the picture as a guide lay out all of the blocks. Working diagonally stitch the blocks together into rows and then stitch the rows together.
17. **Borders**; there are five borders, the fabric sequence for the borders is **8 - 3 - 8 - 4 - 5**.
18. Lay out the five sets of four strips and stitch a square from fabric 6 to each end of two strips from each set. These will be the top and bottom pair in each set.
19. Stitch the side strips of set one first and then the top and bottom strips, repeat for the remaining four sets.
20. Layer the quilt top, wadding and backing fabric and pin or baste in place.
21. Quilt by hand or machine.
22. Apply the binding.


Block 1 – Centre Square - Make 1
