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| 1. Large flower on red ground F771 col.2 | - $\frac{5}{8}$ yard - 60cm |
| 2. Trailing blue curls on black F770 col.1 | - $\frac{3}{8}$ yard - 40cm |
| 3. Tonal blue flowers F772 col.2 | - $\frac{3}{8}$ yard - 40cm |
| 4. Blue hollyhocks on orange F769 col.3 | - $\frac{1}{2}$ yard - $\frac{1}{2}$ m |
| 5. Blue sunburst F767 col.8 | - $\frac{3}{8}$ yard - 40cm |
| 6. Blue and orange geometric fans F768 col.3 | - $\frac{1}{2}$ yard - $\frac{1}{2}$ m |
| 7. Cream Palette H50 col.20 | - $1\frac{3}{8}$ yard - 1.20cm |
- Wadding and backing 48" x 48"

Cutting * see below for angle cut diagrams

From fabric 1 cut

- 8 x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once.
40 x $3\frac{3}{8}$ " x $3\frac{3}{8}$ " squares.

From fabric 2 cut

- 3 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice.
10 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " rectangles, cut a 45° angle from the top right hand corner.
10 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " rectangles, cut a 45° angle from the top left hand corner.

From fabric 3 cut

- 3 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice.
10 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " rectangles, cut a 45° angle from the top right hand corner.
10 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " rectangles, cut a 45° angle from the top left hand corner.

From fabric 4 cut

- 4x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
4 x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x $5\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice.
10 x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " x $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once.

From fabric 5 cut

- 64 x $1\frac{7}{8}$ " x $1\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.

2 x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once.
8 x 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 6 cut

5 x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
5 x 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice.
8 x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once.

From fabric 7 cut

8 x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once.
4 x 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice.
22 x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once.
38 x 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice.



cut a 45° angle from the top right hand corner.



cut a 45° angle from the top left hand corner.


Sewing

Remember to press each seam after sewing to achieve the best finish to your work.

1. **Block 1** - lay out all of the pieces required for block 1 and stack them ready for use.
2. **Corner squares** - stitch a triangle from fabric 7 to the piece from fabric 2 to make a larger triangle.
3. Stitch a triangle from fabric 7 to the piece from fabric 3 to make a larger triangle.
4. Stitch these two triangles together to make a square. Make another three squares in the same way.
5. Stitch a triangle from fabric 3 to a triangle from fabric 6 to make a larger triangle and stitch this triangle to a triangle from fabric 4 to make a square. Make another three squares in the same way.
6. Using the picture as a guide lay out the squares you have just made and the centre square of fabric 6 in three rows of three and stitch together, pressing the seams for each row in opposite directions.
7. This completes block 1, make another four in the same way.
8. **Block 2** – Lay out all of the pieces required for block 2 and stack them ready for use.
9. **Corner squares** - stitch a triangle from fabric 1 to a triangle from fabric 7 together, to make a square. Make another three squares in the same way.
10. Stitch triangles from fabrics 4 and 7 together to make a larger triangle and stitch this to a triangle from fabric 6 to make a square. Make another three in the same way.
11. Using the picture as a guide lay out the squares you have just made and the centre square of fabric 4 in three rows of three and stitch together, pressing the seams for each row in opposite directions.
12. Make another three blocks in the same way.

13. Using the picture as a sequence guide lay out the nine blocks in three rows of three and stitch together, pressing the seams for each row in opposite directions.
14. **Border** – lay out all the pieces required for the border strips and stack them ready for use. Take the squares from fabric 5 and the triangles from fabric 7 and make up sixty four triangles.
15. Using small triangles from fabrics 5 and 7 make up twenty four larger triangles. Eight of these will be used in the corner squares.
16. Refer to the picture as a guide for the sequence and working diagonally stitch the border elements together in threes;
triangle > square > triangle.
Each border strip will have nine squares
17. Make up the corner squares as shown in the picture and stitch them to each end of two of the border strips, these will be the top and bottom strips.
18. Stitch the borders in place, sides first and then the top and bottom.
19. Layer the quilt top, wadding and backing fabric together and pin or baste in place.
Quilt by hand or machine and add the binding using fabric7.
