



## Flutterbright

**Fabrics in this quilt are from Flutterbright by Fabric Freedom**

### Materials

| 1. Red panel F552 col.1                | - | 1 row of butterflies                |
| 2. Red butterfly stripe F556 col.1     | - | $\frac{5}{8}$ yd (60cm)             |
| 3. Orange and red spot F561 col.1      | - | $\frac{1}{2}$ yd ( $\frac{1}{2}$ m) |
| 4. Yellow spot F561 col.8              | - | $\frac{5}{8}$ yd (60cm)             |
| 5. Red butterflies on black F555 col.1 | - | $\frac{3}{8}$ yd (30cm)             |
| 6. Red butterflies on white F555 col.2 | - | $\frac{3}{8}$ yd (30cm)             |
| 7. Large red butterflies F553 col.1    | - | $\frac{1}{2}$ yd ( $\frac{1}{2}$ m) |

Wadding and backing 48" x 48"

### Cutting

$\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances are included in all cutting instructions

From fabric 1 cut - 4 x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From fabric 2 cut - 8 x 2" x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ " strips  
8 x 2" x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " strips  
8 x  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 3 cut - 10 x  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once  
36 x  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 4 cut - 3 x  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice  
10 x  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once  
36 x  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " x  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 5 cut - 9 x 5¼" x 5¼" squares, cut in half diagonally twice  
12 x 3½" x 3½" squares

From fabric 6 cut - 9 x 5¼" x 5¼" squares, cut in half diagonally twice  
8 x 3½" x 3½" squares

From fabric 7 cut - 5 x 6½" x 6½" squares  
3 x 7¼" x 7¼" squares, cut in half diagonally twice  
4 x 3⅜" x 3⅜" squares

## **Sewing**

Two blocks are used to make this quilt plus the mini block 'flying geese'. Remember to press each seam as you sew, to give the best finish to your work.

## **Flying Geese**

1. Refer to the main picture for the colour sequence and lay out all of the pieces needed.
2. To make the flying geese, sew the long sides of the small triangles to the short sides of the large triangles.

## **Block 1**

1. Lay out all of the pieces needed for the block, referring to the picture for the colour sequence.
2. Make up the four 'flying geese'.
3. Sew the block together as follows,
  - top row – small square/flying geese/small square
  - middle row – flying geese/large square/flying geese
  - bottom row - small square/flying geese/small square
4. Sew the three rows together to complete the block and make another four in the same way, taking care that you place each piece in the correct position.

## **Block 2**

1. Lay out all of the pieces needed.
2. Sew the short strips to the left and right sides of the centre square.
3. Sew the longer strips to the top and bottom, to complete the block and make another three blocks.


## **Quilt top**

1. Refer to the main picture and lay out the nine blocks in sequence.
2. Sew the blocks together in three rows of three.


3. Make up the 'flying geese' for the border strips, you will need eighteen for each strip.
4. Make up the corner squares by sewing the long side of each triangle to each side of the centre square, as shown in diagram.
5. Sew a border strip to the left and right sides of the quilt
6. Sew a corner square to each end of the two remaining border strips and sew the strips to the top and bottom of the quilt.
7. Layer the backing fabric, wadding and quilt top and pin or baste together.
8. Quilt by hand or machine and add binding using fabric 3.




*Main diagram*




*Flying Geese*
