| 2. Tropical flowers on black F891 col.2 | - $\frac{3}{8}$ yard - 40cm |
| 3. Orange and red flowers F894 col.2 | - long $\frac{1}{4}$ |
| 4. Red Hibiscus on black F893 col.1 | - $\frac{1}{2}$ yard - $\frac{1}{2}$ m |
| 5. Red Hibiscus on white F893 col.3 | - $\frac{1}{2}$ yard - $\frac{1}{2}$ m |
| 6. Large red flowers F895 col.4 | - $\frac{3}{8}$ yard - 40cm |
| 7. Red and orange leaves F892 col.4 | - $\frac{3}{8}$ yard - 40cm |
| 8. Large yellow flowers F895 col.9 | - $\frac{1}{2}$ yard - $\frac{1}{2}$ m |
| 9. Red Perfect Palette H50 col.14 | - $\frac{3}{8}$ yard - 40cm |
| 10. Yellow leaves F892 col.6 | - long $\frac{1}{4}$ |
| 11. Yellow Perfect Palette H50 col.19 | - $\frac{1}{2}$ yard - $\frac{1}{2}$ m |
- Wadding and backing 54" x 66"

Cutting

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances.

From fabric 1 cut

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips, then join two sets of two strips and trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ ".

4 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips, then join two sets of two strips and trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $50\frac{1}{2}$ ".

From fabric 2 cut

7 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From fabric 3 cut

5 x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 4 cut

42 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From fabric 5 cut

6 x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 6 cut

7 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From fabric 7 cut

7 x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From fabric 8 cut

6 x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 9 cut

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ " strips

2 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ " strips

From fabric 10 cut

5 x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " x $6\frac{7}{8}$ " squares, cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 11 cut

42 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

When you have cut out all of the pieces lay them out and stack them by size shape colour and pattern, ready for use.

Sewing

Remember to press each seam after sewing to achieve the best finish to your work.

1. Take a triangle from fabric 3 and fabric 10 and stitch them together to make a square. Repeat this with the remaining triangles until you have made 10 squares.
2. Take a triangle from fabric 5 and fabric 8 and stitch them together as above, repeat with the remaining triangles until you have made 11 squares.
3. Now take two each of the small squares from fabrics 4 and 11, place matching fabrics diagonally opposite each other - use the picture as a guide. Sew them together to make a larger square. Repeat with the remaining small squares until you have made 21 larger squares.
4. Use the picture as a guide to the sequence and lay out all of the pieces in 9 rows of 7.
5. Working from left to right stitch all the pieces in the first row together. Continue in this way until all of the rows have been completed.
6. Pressing the seams for each row in opposite directions will make it easier to fit the rows together.

7. Next sew the rows together to complete the quilt centre.
8. Add the inner border using fabric 9. Sew the side pieces first then the top and bottom pieces.
9. Add the outer border using fabric 1 sewing the side pieces first and then the top and bottom pieces.
10. Layer together the quilt top, wadding and backing fabric and pin or baste in place.
11. Quilt by hand or machine.
12. Make a binding from left over pieces of fabrics 2 to 10 about 2" wide and sufficient to go all round the quilt with an overlap of about 4".
13. Sew the binding to the quilt to complete the project.
