## Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

You will also need:

- 2 yards wide backing fabric
- 4 yards non directional 42" fabric for backing
- 4-1/4 yards directional 42" fabric for backing
- Batting to 70" X 75"

## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

### From Fabric A, fussy cut:

Six 13" X 10-1/2" rectangles, keeping design centered.

### From Fabric B, cut:

Five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Piece together at the short ends, and trim to yield four 2-1/2" X 42-1/2" strips for side middle border sections. From remainder of long strip, cut eleven 3" X 2-1/2" rectangles

Four 3" x WOF strips. Trim each to 40" X 3" for top and bottom middle border sections

Five 3" X WOF strips. Subcut seventy-seven 3" X 2-1/2" rectangles.

### From Fabric C, cut:

Four 1-1/2" X WOF strips. Trim two to measure 1-1/2" X 40-1/2" for side inner border and two to measure 40" X 1-1/2" for top and bottom inner border

Three 3" X WOF strips. Subcut into forty-four 3" X 2-1/2" rectangles

**From Fabric D, cut:**

Three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Piece together at the short ends, and trim to yield two 2-1/2" X 42-1/2" strips for side border sections. From remainder, cut twelve 3" X 2-1/2" rectangles


Two 3" x WOF strips. Trim to 40" X 3" for top and bottom middle border sections

Four 3" X WOF strips. Subcut into fifty-four 3" X 2-1/2" rectangles."

Six 1-1/4" X WOF strips. Piece together at the short ends and trim to yield two 1-1/4" X 57-1/2" strips for side outer border, and two 54" X 1-1/4" strips for top and bottom outer borders.


Six 2-1/2" X WOF strips for binding.

Assemble the Pieced Blocks for Quilt Center and Corners



**Step 1: Center Pieced Blocks:** From the 3" X 2-1/2" rectangles, gather for each of six blocks:  
twelve Fabric B rectangles  
four Fabric C rectangles  
nine Fabric D rectangles

Arrange in five rows of five rectangles each, as shown in the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the rectangles into rows, pressing the seams to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows. Sew the rows together, pressing the row seams open. The pieced block should measure 13" X 10-1/2". Repeat to make six pieced blocks.





**Step 2: Corner Pieced Blocks:** From the 3" X 2-1/2" rectangles, gather for each corner block:  
four Fabric B rectangles  
two Fabric C rectangles  
three Fabric D rectangles

Arrange in three rows of three rectangles each, as shown in the Corner Block Assembly Diagrams. Sew the rectangles into rows, pressing the seams to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows. Sew the rows together, pressing the row seams open. The Corner pieced block should measure 6-1/2" X 8". Repeat to make four Corner pieced blocks, paying attention to diagram for positioning.

## Assemble the Quilt Center

**Step 3:** Arrange the Fabric A panel rectangles and the center pieced blocks together in four rows of three blocks each, referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew the blocks into rows, pressing the seams toward the panel rectangles. Sew the rows together, pressing the seams open.



**Step 4: Inner Border:** Sew the 1-1/2" X 40-1/2" Fabric C side inner borders to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press the seams away from the quilt center. Sew the 40" X 1-1/2" Fabric C inner borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press the seams away from the quilt center.

**Step 5: Middle Border** Sew one Fabric D 2-1/2" X 42-1/2" middle border strip between two Fabric B 2-1/2" X 42-1/2" middle border strips. Press seams toward the Fabric B strip on the right. Repeat to make two side middle border sets. Sew the side middle border sets to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press these seams away from the quilt center. Sew one Fabric D 40" X 3" middle border strip between two Fabric D 40" X 3" top and bottom middle border strips. Press seams toward top Fabric D strip. Repeat to make top and bottom middle border sets. Following illustration for placement, attach a corner pieced block to each end of the top and bottom middle border sets. Press seams toward center of set. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press these seams away from the quilt center.

**Step 6:** Sew the 1-1/4" X 57-1/2" Fabric D side outer borders to the left and right sides of the quilt. Press the seams toward the border. Sew the Fabric D 54" X 1-1/4" outer border strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press the seams away from the quilt center.

## Completing the Quilt

**Step 7: Prepare the backing:** Trim wide quilt backing to 70" X 75". If using 42" fabric, remove selvedge on one side of each piece. Sew together on long side. Press seam open. Trim to 70" X 75" orienting seam in lengthwise direction if using directional fabric. Seam will be horizontal with non-directional fabric.

**Step 8: Prepare the binding:** Sew six 2-1/2 X WOF strips of binding Fabric D together at 2-1/2" side with diagonal seam.

**Step 9: Finishing:** Layer the Quilt Top, Batting, and Backing. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
