## Night Owl

Quilt Designed by eQuilter


Please read all instructions before beginning. Pre-washing recommended for hand dyes only. Pre-washing NOT recommended for other fabrics.

## Yardages and Cutting

WOF is width of fabric from selvage edge to selvage edge. Remove as little fabric as possible when removing selvages and squaring strip ends.

## Night Owl panel

- Trim to $421 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide x $301 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ tall.


## 1 yard dark purple texture

- 2 strips $6^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; trim to $331 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for side borders.
- 6 strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF; cut into the following strips and label with the letter given:
(2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{E}$
(2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 161 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{D}$
(4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{A}$
(6) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" B
(4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{C}$

1/4 yard medium purple hand dye
1/4 yard dark olive texture
1/4 yard medium olive texture
1/4 yard light olive hand dye
From each fabric, cut the following:

- 1 strip 4 1/2" x WOF.


## Completing the Quilt

Use a 1/4" seam allowance for all stitching. Press seams as directed. Refer to the exploded quilt diagram as needed.

1. Sew the $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ WOF dark olive, medium olive, light olive and medium purple strips lengthwise together in the order shown to make a $161 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF strip set. Press seams in the direction of the arrows. Crosscut the strip set into (16) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 161 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ segments.

2. Stitch the $2^{\prime \prime} \times 421 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ light purple strips to the top and bottom of the panel. Press seams toward the strips. Sew the $2^{\prime \prime} \times 331 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ light purple strips and then the $6^{\prime \prime} \times 331 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ dark purple strips to the sides to complete the $331 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 561 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ panel section. Press seam toward each added strip.
3. Sew 2 segments together on the medium purple ends and add dark purple A strips to the dark olive ends to make a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 561 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ row. Press seam to one side in the center and toward the dark olive ends. Repeat to make a second row. Stitch the rows to the top and bottom of the panel section. Press seams toward the rows.
4. Stitch a dark purple B strip between the medium purple ends of 2 segments and add dark purple B strips to the dark olive ends to make a row. Press seams toward the dark purple strip in the center and toward the dark olive ends. Repeat to make a second row. Sew the rows to the top and bottom of the panel section. Press seams toward the rows.
5. Sew a dark purple D strip between the medium purple ends of 2 segments and add dark purple C strips to the dark olive ends to make a row. Press seams toward the dark purple strip in the center and toward the dark olive ends. Repeat to make a second row. Stitch the rows to the top and bottom of the panel section.
 Press seams toward the rows.
6. Stitch a dark purple E strip between the medium purple ends of 2 segments to make a row. Press seams toward the dark purple strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the rows to the top and bottom of the panel section to complete the top. Press seams toward the rows.
7. If using $44 / 45$ " backing fabric, remove the selvage edges from the backing pieces. Join the pieces on the long edges with a $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press seam open. Trim to make the $72^{\prime \prime} \times 65^{\prime \prime}$ backing piece.
8. Layer the quilt top with the backing and batting pieces. Quilt as desired. Trim batting and backing even with the top.
9. Join the multicolor fans binding strips on the short ends with diagonal seams to make a long strip. Press seams in one direction. Press the strip in half along the length with wrong sides together.
10. Bind the quilt edges using your favorite method to complete the quilt.
