## Yardage Requirements

(Wildwood Way collection)
3/4 yard of Fabric A - \#3089_001
3/4 yard of Fabric B - \#3091_001
1 yard of Fabric C - \#3087_001
5/8 yard of Fabric D- \#3088_001
1/2 yard of Fabric E - \#3092_001
3/4 yard of Fabric F- White Tonal
1-3/4 yards of Wide Backing fabric
56 " square piece of batting
Plastic template material
Basic sewing supplies

## Cutting and Preparation

Note: Trace the templates on p. 5-7 onto plastic template material, cut out, and use to cut the shapes indicated below, noting that the templates are also used in reverse.

## From Fabric A, cut:

Four of template \#2
Five 2-1/4" x WOF strips for binding
From Fabric B, cut:
Four each of template \#3, \#3r, \#6, \#6r \#9 and \#9r

## From Fabric C, cut:

Four each of template \#4, \#10, \#10r, \#11 and \#11r Four 5-1/2" x WOF strips, recut into four 5-1/2" x 30-1/2" strips

## From Fabric D, cut:

Four each of template \#5, \#5r, and \#4r
Four 1-1/2" x WOF strips, recut into two 1-1/2" x $28-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips and two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 30-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips

From Fabric E, cut:
Four each of template \#8 and \#8r Four of template \#2r

From Fabric F, cut:
Four each of template \#1, \#1r, \#7, \#7r
Four 3-1/2" x WOF strips, recut into two 3-1/2" x $22-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips and two $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 28-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

## Making the Center Block

1. Referring to the labeled quarter block and diagrams below, sew the indicated pieces together in pairs ( 1 and $2,1 r$ and $2 r, 3$ and 4, $3 r$ and $4 r$, etc.).

2. Sew together $3 / 4$ and $5 / 6$ units, and then add $1 / 2$ and $7 / 8$ units. Do the same for the reverse units.

3. Join the two halves to make a quarter block. Make a total of four quarter blocks. Square to 11-1/2".

4. Sew the quarter blocks together into rows, and then join the rows to complete the center block. Square to measure 22-1/2".


## Making the Corner Blocks

1. Referring to the labeled corner block and diagram below, sew the indicated pieces together to create two half blocks.

2. Sew the two half blocks together to make a corner block. Make a total of four corner blocks. Square to measure 5-1/2".


## Assembling the Quilt

Note: Refer to the Quilt Assembly Diagram on p. 4 as you work.

1. Sew $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 22-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $F$ strips to opposite sides of the center block. Sew the $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 28-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F strips to the top and bottom.
2. Sew $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 28-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $D$ strips to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew 1-1/2" x 30-1/2" Fabric D strips to the top and bottom.
3. Noting orientation, sew corner blocks to both short ends of a 5-1/2" x 30-1/2" Fabric C strip. Make two pieced borders. Sew the remaining two 5-1/2" x 30-1/2" Fabric C strips to opposite sides of the quilt. Sew the pieced borders to the top and bottom.

## Finishing

Lay the backing right side down, batting and quilt top right side up. Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Use the five $2-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strips to bind the quilt.
