## Quilt Designed by eQuilter



60" x 51"

Skill Level: Intermediate

Please read all instructions before beginning. Pre-washing recommended for hand dye only. Pre-washing NOT recommended for other fabrics.

## Yardages and Cutting

WOF is width of fabric from selvage edge to selvage edge. Remove as little fabric as possible when trimming selvages and squaring strip ends.

## Victorian Kitty panel

- Trim to $421 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide x $331 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ tall.


## 3/4 yard red ombre print

- 2 strips 10 3/4" x WOF; cut into (5) 10 3/4" squares.


## 1 3/4 yards black solid

- 2 strips 10 3/4" x WOF; cut into (5) 10 3/4" squares and (4) $5^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
- 6 strips 3 1/2" x WOF for border.
- 4 strips 2" x WOF; trim to 2 strips each 42 1/2" and $361 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for panel framing.


## 5/8 yard aqua hand dye

- 6 strips $21 / 4$ x WOF for binding.


## 3 7/8 yards of 44/45' backing fabric <br> - 2 pieces 67" x WOF <br> OR

2 yards wide backing fabric

- 1 piece 67 " x 76"


## Batting

- 1 piece 67 " x 76"


## Piecing the Units

Use a 1/4" seam allowance for all stitching. Press all seams as directed.

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the red squares. Repeat to draw a line on the remaining diagonal.
2. Place a marked square right sides together with a black $103 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square. Sew $1 / 4$ " out on each side of the marked lines.
3. Measure and mark $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ over on each side of the top left and bottom right corners. Cut the square in half horizontally and vertically to make (4) $53 / 8$ " squares. Cut each smaller square in half on the marked line. Press the stitched triangles open with seam allowance to the black side to make (2) $5^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{\prime \prime}$ triangle units. Repeat with the 3 remaining smaller squares to make 8 triangle units.
4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make a total of 40 triangle units. Set aside 4 units for another project.

## Completing the Quilt

1. Sew the $2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x} 421 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ black strips to the top and bottom of the panel. Press seams toward the strips. Stitch the 2" x 36 1/2" strips to the sides to complete the $451 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 361 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ framed panel. Press seams toward the strips.
2. Stitch 8 triangle units together to make a $5^{\prime \prime} \times 361 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side strip, turning the units and placing the darker red units at the ends of the strips and lighter red units in the center as shown. Press seams to one side. Repeat to make a second side strip. Sew to the sides of the framed panel. Press seams toward the framed panel.
3. In the same manner, sew 10 triangle units together to make a strip. Press seams to one side. Add $5^{\prime \prime}$ black squares to the ends
 to make the $5^{\prime \prime} \times 541 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top strip. Press seams toward the squares. Repeat to make the bottom strip. Stitch the strips to the top and bottom of the panel section to complete the $541 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x $451 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ quilt center. Press seams toward the panel section.
4. Sew the $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF black strips short ends together to make a long strip. Press seams to one side. Cut into 2 strips each $601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $451 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Stitch the shorter strips to the sides of the quilt center and the longer strips to the top and bottom to complete the top. Press seams toward the strips.
5. If using 44/45" backing fabric, remove the selvage edges from the backing pieces. Join the pieces on the long edges with a $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press seam open. Trim to make the 76 "-wide x 67 "-tall backing piece.
6. Layer the top with the backing and batting pieces. Quilt as desired. Trim batting and backing even with the top.
7. Join the aqua hand-dye binding strips on the short ends with diagonal seams to make a long strip. Press seams in one direction. Press the strip in half along the length with wrong sides together. Bind the quilt edges using your favorite method to complete the quilt.
