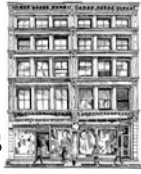

Fabric Requirements

2³/₄ yards Nature-CD6900 Multi
1¹/₄ yards Studio-C3096 Gold
7/8 yard Studio-C3096 Pumpkin
1¹/₄ yards Studio-C3096 Green
(includes 5/8 yard for binding)
1 panel (1 yard) Panel-CD6899 Multi
5/8 yard Studio-C3096 Citrus
4⁷/₈ yards Nature-CD6900 Multi (backing)
80" x 87" batting

Cutting

From Nature-CD6900 Multi:

- Cut three 2¹/₂" x width-of-fabric (WOF) strips. Sew the strips together end to end and cut two 2¹/₂" x 60" strips.
- Cut three 1¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end and cut two 1¹/₂" x 60" strips.
- Cut three 4³/₄" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end and cut two 4³/₄" x 60" strips.
- Cut two 2¹/₂" x 66¹/₂" length-of-fabric (LOF) strips.
- Cut two 1¹/₂" x 66¹/₂" LOF strips.
- Cut two 4³/₄" x 58" LOF strips.
- From remnants, cut four 2¹/₂" squares, four 2¹/₂" x 1¹/₂" LOF rectangles, four 2¹/₂" x 1¹/₂" WOF rectangles and four 1¹/₂" squares.

From Studio-C3096 Gold:

- Cut one 6" x WOF strip. Sub-cut one 6" square. Draw a line diagonally from corner to corner on the wrong side of each square. Trim the remaining strip down to 3³/₈" wide.
- Cut three 3³/₈" x WOF strips. Adding the remnant of the previous WOF strip, cut forty 3³/₈" squares. Draw a line diagonally from corner to corner on the wrong side of each square.
- Cut two 5¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut two 5¹/₂" x 19" strips and two 5¹/₂" x 17¹/₂" strips.
- Cut seven 1¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Cut two 1¹/₂" x 66¹/₂" strips, two 1¹/₂" x 60" strips and twelve 1¹/₂" squares.
- Cut one 1¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut four 1¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" strips and four 1¹/₂" x 2¹/₂" rectangles.

From Studio-C3096 Pumpkin:

- Cut one 6¹/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut three 6¹/₄" squares.
- Cut twelve 1¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Cut two 1¹/₂" x 56" strips, two 1¹/₂" x 51¹/₂" strips, two 1¹/₂" x 66¹/₂" strips, two 1¹/₂" x 60" strips and four 1¹/₂" squares.
- Cut one 1¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut four 1¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" strips and four 1¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" rectangles.

From Studio-C3096 Green:

- Cut four 1¹/₂" x WOF strips. Trim two strips to 1¹/₂" x 42" and two strips to 1¹/₂" x 37¹/₂" strips.
- Cut one 6¹/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut four 6¹/₄" squares and one 6" square.
- Cut six 1¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Cut two 1¹/₂" x 54" strips and two 1¹/₂" x 49¹/₂" strips.
- Cut eight 2¹/₂" x WOF strips for binding.

From CD6899 Multi:

- Trim panel to 35¹/₂" x 42".

From Studio-C3096 Citrus:

- Cut one 6¹/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut three 6¹/₄" squares.
- Cut seven 1¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Cut two 1¹/₂" x 66¹/₂" strips and two 1¹/₂" x 60" strips.
- From remnants, cut eight 1¹/₂" x 2¹/₂" rectangles and twelve 1¹/₂" squares.

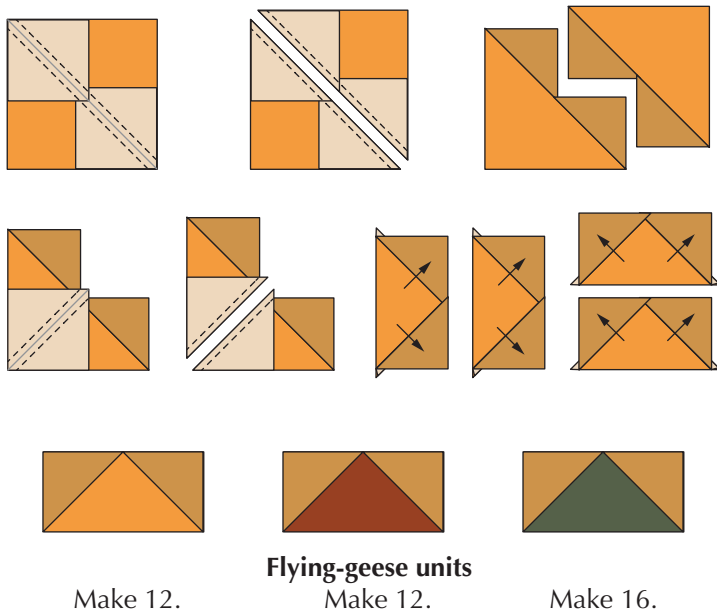


Quilt Top Assembly

All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together. Note the orientation of all directional prints when assembling the quilt top.

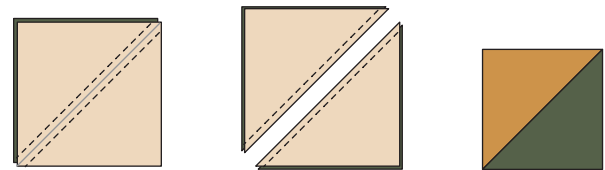
1. Sew one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" C3096 Green border to each side of the CD6899 Multi panel. Press the seams toward the border. Sew one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $37\frac{1}{2}$ " C3096 Green border to the top and the other to the bottom. Press the seams toward the border.
2. Make the flying-geese units as shown in Figure 1 by placing a $3\frac{3}{8}$ " C3096 Gold square on opposite corners of a $6\frac{1}{4}$ " C3096 Citrus square. Sew a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on each side of the drawn line. Cut along the drawn line. Press seams toward the Gold. Repeat with a $3\frac{3}{8}$ " Gold square on the remaining Citrus corners. Press seams toward the Gold. This makes four flying-geese units. Repeat to make a total of twelve Citrus/Gold, twelve Pumpkin/Gold and sixteen Green/Gold flying-geese units.

3. Place a 6" C3096 Gold square on top of a 6" C3096 Green square. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the drawn line. Cut along the drawn line to make two half-square triangle (HST) units. Press seams toward the Green. Trim to $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square (figure 2).

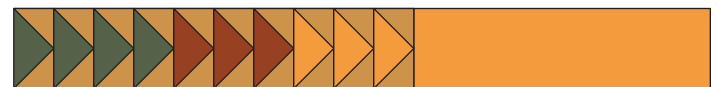

4. Sew the flying-geese units together as shown in Figure 3, using four Green, three Pumpkin, and three Citrus. Add a $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 19" C3096 Gold strip on the right end of the strip. Make two.

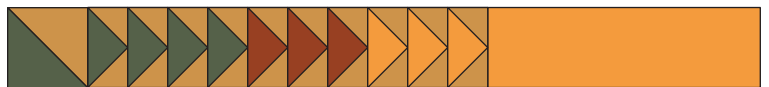


Side Border

5. Repeat the flying-geese assembly adding the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $17\frac{1}{2}$ " C3096 Gold strip and the $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Gold/Green HST to make two top/bottom borders as shown in Figure 4.

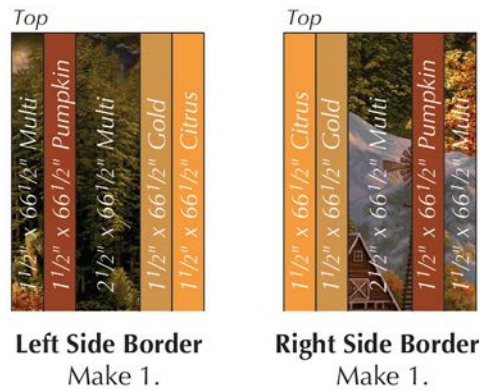
Top/Bottom Border

Make 2.

6. Noting the orientation, sew one pieced flying-geese border to each side of the quilt center, then add the top and bottom flying-geese borders.
7. Sew one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 54" C3096 Green strip to each side of the quilt center, then sew one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $49\frac{1}{2}$ " C3096 Green strip to the top and the other to the bottom.
8. Sew one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 56" C3096 Pumpkin strip to each side of the quilt center, then sew one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $51\frac{1}{2}$ " C3096 Pumpkin strip to the top and the other to the bottom.
9. Sew one $4\frac{3}{4}$ " x 58" CD6900 Multi strip to each side of the quilt center.

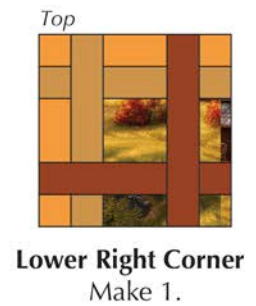
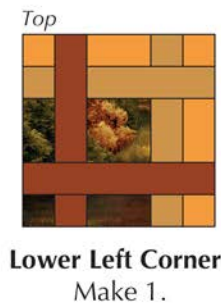
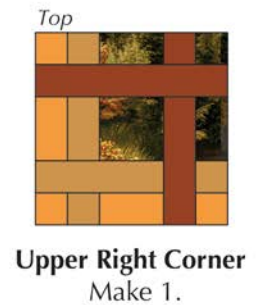
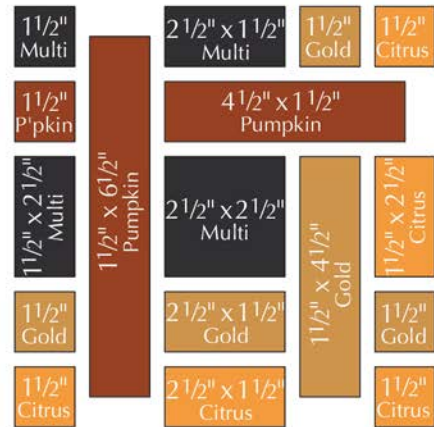
- Sew one $4\frac{3}{4}$ " x 60" CD6900 Multi strip to the top and the other to the bottom of the quilt center.
- Following Figure 5, make two outer side pieced borders by sewing together the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $66\frac{1}{2}$ " C3096 Citrus strip, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $66\frac{1}{2}$ " C3096 Gold strip, $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $66\frac{1}{2}$ " CD6900 Multi strip, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $66\frac{1}{2}$ " C3096 Pumpkin strip and the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $66\frac{1}{2}$ " CD6900 Multi strip in order. Noting the orientation, sew one border to each side of the quilt center.

- Make the outer top and bottom pieced borders by sewing together the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60" C3096 Citrus strip, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60" C3096 Gold strip, $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60" CD6900 Multi strip, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60" C3096 Pumpkin strip and the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 60" CD6900 Multi strip.
- Sew the four corner blocks as shown in Figure 6. Lay out the seventeen pieces of each corner block before sewing the pieces together to make sure the direction of CD6900 Multi is correct. Each corner block is constructed the same, but the orientation of the Multi print units differ.

14. Matching adjacent seams, sew the appropriate corner block to each end of the pieced top and bottom border units. Sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt center.

Finishing

15. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing, and quilt as desired.
16. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
17. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.
